Breakdown with cohost Fuifuilupe Niumeitolu, Alex Tan & featured guests

Native Hawaiian and Indigenous elders and youth will speak about the Thirty Meter Telescope (TMT) proposed to be built on the sacred site of Mauna Kea, as just one example of a colonial, university land-grab project in violation of Indigenous peoples. We will discuss the relationship between this desecration of sacred lands and violence against Indigenous women and their bodies throughout the world. Speakers will share their experiences -- and especially the role of women and Mahu/ queer/ two-spirit people -- in leading the resistance against the University of California's costly, colonial project.
